### **Profiles of the Board of Directors**

### JENNIE ABRAHAMSON

I discovered a joy of connecting people with the information they seek to live and improve their own and others' lives while working in information and reference services in the USA at Cornell and the University of Washington – university libraries with large public clienteles. I have worked in graduate social science and humanities, undergraduate, art and architecture, music, and business school libraries. I've also volunteered as a health librarian in a transition-from-homelessness shelter. I earned a Master of Library and Information Science from the University of Washington iSchool. I received a Master of Biomedical Informatics with a focus on medical anthropology and consumer health informatics from the School of Medicine at Oregon Health and Science University while completing a four year US National Institutes of Health/National Library of Medicine-funded research training fellowship.

My experiences working in academic and community reference and information services inspire my commitment to improving information services to help people solve problems in their everyday lives. I am active as a researcher, speaker, and writer on interpersonal, peer-to-peer, and family information seeking and use. I have completed research and evaluation projects on Internet-based health information seeking in chronic disease, disaster relief medicine, and elders' home medication management. I have also completed doctoral-level work in library and information science at the University of Western Ontario, where I earned a Master of Health Information Science in 2017 while investigating information and health service and policy implications of how storytelling can help us to better understand end of life family caregivers' unmet needs.

I joined the Board of Directors in 2016.

### **DEBORAH DOHERTY**

I graduated as an Early Childhood Educator from Sheridan College and has been in the Information and Referral field since 2001. Working at Child Development Resource Connection Peel (CDRCP) as the Manager, Information and Data, I have had the opportunity to provide the Peel community with information relating to child care and services for those with special needs.

I worked closely with other CDRCP staff and community partners in Peel in the creation of an online database that helps to provide direction and assistance to those residing in Peel, including the francophone community. I also provided direction in creating and upgrading websites for several partner agencies of CDRCP. I also worked with several community

collaborative related to delivering services to those with special needs, while managing the client based database relating to that collaborative.

I am an active member of several planning tables in Peel, and now chair the Autism Spectrum Working group in Peel.

### TRICIA KORBUT

I began my career in community and social services more than 25 years ago as a crisis intervention worker at a women's shelter in Sault Ste. Marie. I have also worked in the education field as a teacher and the trainer/volunteer coordinator for a distress centre.

For the last 12 years I have been the Supervisor of Information and Referral Services at ConnexOntario. In my role I oversee a 24/7 staff responding to 6 phone lines and am the principal staff trainer. I also provide additional training as a Master ASIST trainer and SafeTALK facilitator, plus an occasional guest lecturer on call management, working with difficult callers, suicide and loss.

Currently I sit on several committees and am on the Board of Directors at Addiction Services of Thames Valley. During my personal time, I enjoy spending time with my family, playing soccer and being a soccer mom.

I am joining the Board of Directors in 2017.

### **MARCUS LOGAN**

I am the Manager, Community Information for the Oakville Public Library - the lead agency for the Halton Information Providers (a regional coalition of data providers including the Burlington, Halton Hills, Oakville and Milton public library systems and the local child care directory) and manages the Halton Community Services Database. I came to the Oakville Public Library in November 2016, bringing 20 years' experience in community engagement, youth support and children's mental health in the local Halton community by connecting individuals and agencies to programs and services in my role with Information Oakville.

I currently represent Information Oakville and the Oakville Public Library on several committees such as Halton Equity and Diversity Roundtable, LGBTQ+ Youth Collective Impact, Halton Indigenous Educators Committee and the Professional Advisory Committee for the Lighthouse for Grieving Children.

As a community advocate and volunteer, I am also a board director for the Halton Children's Aid Society, while also fulfilling my love of the outdoors as a volunteer Camp Director for past 7 years at Camp Ten Oaks.

I am joining the Board of Directors in 2017.

### **LESLEY RUSSELL**

I was the Executive Director of Community Information Hamilton from 1989 until 2010. From 2010 until my retirement, I was the Regional Data Coordinator working with the data partners of 211 Central South.

I have been a part of the growth of Information and Referral within my own area and in Ontario. I was there through the Ontario Trillium Foundation grants of the 1980s and 90s which saw the index card systems at local centres become automated databases alongside the introduction and continuing work of standards, protocols and classification systems which are now throughout Ontario and beyond.

Since my retirement, I have continued to provide support and training as a consultant and volunteer for CIOC users. I joined the Board of Directors in 2012.

### **TEAL WISE**

I have worked for Information Orillia for more than 4 years and am a Registered Social Worker. I received my Social Work degree from Lakehead University. I have my CIRS and am working towards my CRS.

I collaborate with other agencies in the city to reduce the risk of harm to those determined at risk by assisting in interventions. I run a Ministry Risk-driven database in partnership with Victim Services and the Orillia OPP.

me Information Orillia was not on my radar as a place to practice social work. However, over the years I have come to realize that providing information and referrals to the public is much more than giving a phone number; it is about assessment, empowerment and advocacy. At Information Orillia we work with some of the most vulnerable people in our area who really do not know where to turn. We really are the place to go when you do not know where to go. I love assisting others to find their path to a healthier and happier place in life than when they came through the door or picked up the phone.

I am also currently the Vice President on the InformOntario Board of Directors which I joined in 2014.

### 2016 Activities and Events

### PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

2016 has been a year of consolidation and growth for InformOntario in particular and the Information & Referral sector in general. We are moving forward, both in numbers attending our annual Learning and Networking Symposia and in our relationships with other colleagues across Ontario and Canada.

We used a town hall format (and doing it again in 2017) to elicit good feedback from Symposium attendees about what IO can provide that benefits our members. The board is using the feedback as a blue print for outreach and membership development strategies.

In the fall of 2016, we hosted another IO Lunch n' Learn webinar on partnership development with local elected officials. More will be planned in the future.

Our 2016 Symposium in Hamilton was notable for two reasons – the board envisioned and the Symposium committee created a Symposium Sponsorship Package. With this in hand, we secured both continuing support (from thehealthline.ca Information Network )and new support (InformCanada and HUB International) which allowed us to present an expanded program. Discussions led to InformCanada presenting a national stream of workshops, which in turn, has created an opportunity to investigate the current relationship between IO and IC.

The IO Communications Committee continues to strengthen and refine the ongoing IO Connector newsletter, as well as build the IO website with content. The ability to offer online member payment options began at year end. We continue to look at ways utilize the website capabilities and other external sources.

Thank you for an action packed year for IO, with board members and committees working hard for our members. Barbara McLachlan continues to provide solid and stalwart administrative assistance and her dedication is boundless – many thanks.

IO is also a member of the Ontario Non Profit Network (ONN) which, in turn, offers an exclusive insurance program through HUB International for registered non-profits corporations operating in Onario.

The Committee is a continuation of the work after the conclusion of the Building Local Information Support to Ontario Newcomers (BLISON) project funded by the Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration.

### **Communications Committee**

Our quarterly information/promotional newsletter is distributed to more than 130 subscribers from member organizations and their staff members, former members, stakeholders, and others. Editor Teal Wise uses the features and tools of MailChimp for creating editions and managing the distribution list.

The cmte coordinated the first video (digital storytelling) contest. In 2016, there were 3 entries. The winner – selected by a panel from our membership – was thehealthline.ca of London. All videos are posted on InformOntario's You-Tube site.

The cmte has also worked on improving and/or creating online features for use by the membership, including a new Symposium registration form, expanding the membership form, a proxy voting form and the video contest submission form.
